

PATIENT INFORMATION LEAFLET: TEXTILE dye mix

Your patch test shows that you have a contact allergy to : Textile dye mix

Definition: The textile dye mix is a mixture of eight different disperse dyes, namely: Disperse Blue 35 Disperse Blue 106 Disperse Blue 124 Disperse Yellow 3 Disperse Orange 1 Disperse Orange 3 Disperse Red 1 Disperse Red 17

Use and occurrence:

Disperse dyes are used to dye synthetic fabrics such as polyester, polyamide, acrylics, and acetate fibers. If you are contact allergic to the textile dye mix and have skin problems, it is recommended that you wear clothing made from natural fibers such as cotton, wool, linen, rayon, or viscose. This applies primarily to apparel that has direct contact with the skin such as lingerie, blouses / sweaters, pants, socks, stockings, exercise clothes, etc. and secondly to jackets, out- door clothing, and other apparel that are not worn directly against the skin. If you do not wear clothing made from natural fibers, avoid strongly dyed synthetics or mixed fabrics. You should wash new clothes before use and avoid fabrics that fade. A newly purchased garment can be tested by using it for several consecutive days. If you do not develop skin problems then you should be able to use the garment in the future.
